Thank you for your reception report for July 31, 1977. Our logs indicate that WNUS was carrying a Red Sox game on this date. We can confirm that the announcement for an auto dealer at 1:19 A.M. was broadcast by this station. Our logs show that at 1:25 A.M., we were carrying the Red Sox Network Scoreboard, which is our normal practice at the conclusion of all games.

You make mention of hearing an instrumental version of the Star Spangled Banner around 1:03 A.M. on several occasions. We do not use the national anthem either on sign-on or sign-off and generally we do not sign off until about 1:07 or so.

We now program all-news between the hours of 5:30 A.M. and 6:30 P.M., and feature talk programming from 6:30 P.M. until sign-off. Regarding the litigation you cite in your letter, I can not comment on it, on the advice of counsel.

Our frequency checks and proof of performance are conducted by Dan Churchill of Commercial Radio Company, in Proctorsville, Vermont. It would be best to contact him directly for this information.

I hope I have been of assistance to you in your DXing efforts.
